For over 100 years they have helped discerning customers personalise furniture for every room, every reason and every style.

HOW WERE YOU INSPIRED TO PURSUE YOUR DESIGN WORK?

Born and raised in Dubai, I found inspiration from books and magazines my father used to place by my bedside. I was always passionate and curious about art for as long as I can remember and I travelled frequently collecting artefacts from around the world. I guess the combination of my passion for art and travel led me to become an interior designer.

HOW DO YOU GO ABOUT CREATING YOUR PROJECTS?

I like to take my time and have a cyclical approach to design. Truly understanding how the client would like to utilise the space is the first step. The second step is to generate the most creative solution. Finally, analysing the most rational way of implementing the creative solutions within the context of the space.

WHAT IS YOUR FAVOURITE PIECE AND WHY?

Charles and Ray Eames Lounge + Ottoman is my favourite, other than its serene design and



technological advancement of its time, it is the chair I used to read all my books and magazines growing up. It has a sentimental value to me.

WHAT PLACE MOST INSPIRES YOU? The sea.

BEST DECORATING TIP?

Take your time to develop and narrow down the concept. Once that's established everything stems from there. An important tip I would give is also to think about "decorating" as a process not a single task.

WHAT TREND ARE YOU ENJOYING NOW?

We are enjoying a shift from classic taste to a more contemporary design with an eclectic flair.

WHAT IS YOUR FAVOURITE PIECE OF ART?

An impossible question to answer. I think throughout life one goes through different phases, mentalities and personalities, in a way, and during those various times different art pieces resonate more. One that I keep reverting back to are Modigliani works. He is my





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favourite painter, and was originally trained as a sculptor, which is translated in his paintings through his modern elongated style. Giacometti and Brancusi are my favourite sculptors. So you can say any work from the above artist are my favourite pieces.

WHAT'S NEXT FOR THE GALLERY?

Whenever we discuss the future of NAKKASH Gallery we always emphasise that our growth must fall in line with our values and philosophy: superior quality and elegant design. Having said that, we will be participating in Design Days Dubai for the fourth consecutive year.
